Nursing: Four fields











Blended Learning Nursing



Provides a flexible way to study using mainly digital technologies, and also includes practical and hands-on experience.

You'll attend the campus in Huddersfield for a maximum total of 20 days per year of the course.

You'll also undertake practice placements across the NHS and healthcare organisations in a setting close to home.

Occupational Therapy



Work with people of all ages to improve or maintain their health and wellbeing.

Help them overcome the effects of disability caused by physical or psychological illness, ageing or accident.





Operating Department Practice





Operating Department Practitioners (ODP's) work alongside surgeons, anaesthetists and theatre nurses to care for patients during surgery.





Combine scientific principles in Optometry and vision sciences with practical clinical skills from the first year.

The UK regulator for Optometry, the General Optical Council (GOC) has published revised standards for all optometry providers in the UK. The current BSc(Hons) course is being adapted and will be replaced by a 4 year integrated Masters course in 2024.

Paramedic Science



Well-known for working within Ambulance Services providing immediate and emergency care in response to 999 calls made by the public. Paramedics now also work in other areas of healthcare, including GP practices, hospital emergency departments and police custody suites.










You'll combine studying science theory with developing practical and professional skills, whilst focusing on medicines and patients.

As you progress, you'll have the chance to work in our formulation lab, where medicines are made, and get to grips with aspects of the profession , from prescriptions and patients, the development and design of drugs and the role of pharmacists in society.

Assess, advise and treat people with a variety of conditions.

Podiatrists aim to improve the mobility, independence and quality of life of their patients.



Responsible for the care of the lower limb and foot.



Speech and Language Therapy





Speech and Language Therapists work with individuals of all ages and across the lifespan to facilitate and enable their speech, language, communication, feeding and/or swallowing difficulties.



Health and Social Care BSc(Hons) and MSci

Complete a compulsory 160 hour work placement in your third year

Social Work MSci

Undertake a compulsory 70 day work placement in year 3 and a compulsory

100 day work placement in year 4.
